



Vietnam has no future under communist regime

To justify their act of treason, Vietnamese communist leadership promoted a slogan that said: the survival of the Party will guarantee the survival of each party member (Con Đảng Còn Mình). This led the communist leadership to brutally suppress those Vietnamese patriots who had the gut to protest against Red Chinese violation of Vietnam territory on land and at sea. Hanoi's open-border policy allows Chinese crossing the Northern border freely without passport or visa. This open border is an effective measure leading to active migration of Chinese to Vietnam, accompanied by free import of Chinese goods without taxes.

Two direct consequences: first, this is a dangerous policy of converting Vietnam into a sanctuary of Chinese migrants who would over-populate Vietnam in the near future; second, Chinese are allowed to populate strategic locations in Vietnam that would threaten national security of Vietnam.

FORUM: WHAT HAPPENED...

-- A peaceful, free, and open Indo-Pacific is especially vital to our economy in the 21st century... The Indo-Pacific is home to half of 20 fastest growing economies. The Indo-Pacific currently contains over a third of global GDP and 60% of the

global GDP growth. By 2030, 65% of the world's middle class will reside in the Indo-Pacific -- The U.S. government has publicly stated that the "nine dash line" which China and Taiwan assert delineates their claims to the South China Sea is contrary to international law. Secretary for East Asian and Pacific Affairs, Danny Russel, testified before the House Committee on Foreign Affairs and said "Under International law, maritime claims in the South China Sea must be derived from land features. Any use of the nine dash line by China to claim maritime rights not based on claimed land features would be inconsistent with international law". Under UNCLOS, negotiated in the 70s and 80s, countries can claim exclusive rights to the fish and mineral resources within Exclusive Economic Zones, which can extend 200 nautical miles from a continental shore line or around islands that can support habitation.

-- In Paracel ilands, large military complexes were built. On Woody island, there is a large airfield with a 3000m x 250 m runway, and jet fighters have been deployed. Ammunitions and missiles depots are in the North side. Larger sea



ports with tall communication towers and radars and other facilities are in operation. A large multi-story building is served as a military headquarter for the region. Several hundred soldiers have been stationed there. Military fortified fortresses have been erected. In Spratlys, a system of naval bases built on 8 artificial islands is found in the middle of Vietnam's East Sea. -- On the three largest Islands, Subi, Mischief and Fiery Cross, there e airfields to accomodate large aircrafts landing and taking off. On each island, a squadron of 24 long range bombers is being deployed, not including some most advanced aircraft J-20's or long range stealth fighters. They are combat-ready. Seaports, weapons with missiles and ammunition depots, advanced infrared sense radar network and communication facilities, gun emplacements are also detected.

-- There are underground depots of supplies and materials. Anti-aircraft and anti-ship missiles are camouflaged. China now can project its military power anywhere in SoutheastAsia and as far away as northern Australia. She is capable of securing the area, including blocking the Malacca Straits anytime she wants.
